## GSB ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: ROBIN CHRISTIAN

From the first time Robin Christian stood behind the counter as a part-time teller in college, she immediately saw her future, full of opportunities for advancement and career growth. As senior vice president, retail operations, Premier Community Bank, Marion, Wisconsin, Christian is on a mission to mentor and bring as many individuals, particularly women, as she can into the industry that she loves and a career that she has found rewarding for the last 25 years.

"I would like to be able to keep people in the banking industry, educating and encouraging younger people and minorities to join our industry," she says. "There are so many different career options and professional possibilities in banking. Banking

is not boring; there is never a dull moment!" She adds, "Sometimes it's not sexy at all, and nobody really thinks about it as a career. But it can absolutely be a phenomenal career."

Christian says the plentiful opportunities in banking are what have made it an ideal career. Christian says her GSB education gave her an understanding of a larger picture of her organization and the banking industry. "There were so many smart people at the school with different responsibilities at their organizations that I began to understand the meaning of teamwork and the coordination it takes to be successful," she says. She adds that the program led to the realization that though her technical skills would contribute to the organization, it was her ability to work with others and encourage others that would make Premier successful.

Christian adds that though her community bank was purchased in 2008 and her career trajectory there was hindered, it was her GSB education that allowed her to know how to look for other great community banks as options for employment and be able to make a difference in those organizations quickly.

Another area Christian is making an impact is by bringing more women into banking.

"The industry is fascinating in how it operates, how banks can make a difference in communities and how much of our government is focused on our financial industry—and not just in regulations," she says. "I also want to make a difference to other female bankers as a role model, by encouraging them to learn more and to know that that they can be a female, a mother, a wife and a leader within their organizations."

Christian is committed to shaping the careers of women in banking and formally mentors a new female in human resources at Premier. "She's not a banker, but she's an integral part of the process in our organization," she says. "I can help her to understand the banking roles." Christian adds that Premier does have a formal leadership program which provides opportunities for all its employees to get involved in leadership through education and training. In particular, she mentions the Positive Intelligence coaching program, which she says plays off emotional intelligence but is more about helping individuals to understand themselves, their reactions in certain situations and how to handle these reactions. She encourages all her branch managers, who happen to be majority women, to participate in the program. "This coaching is meant to address that annoying voice in their head that tells them they can't do something."

After completing two master's degrees, an MBA and MS-LOD, Christian enjoys spending time outdoors and has a continued passion for learning. She says it's not uncommon for her to take a tech school course on sewing, reiki, gardening, mushroom growing or crypto currency. Additionally, she and her husband recently bought a home in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, that boasts many unique plants and a beautiful garden. This spurned her with new herbal recipes, making her own vanilla extracts and learning to grow medicinal herbs.

"I wanted to learn more about these plants so I could care for them and realized quickly that they all had medicinal purposes," she says. "A new interest was born. It is truly amazing what is around us that is meant to help us."

She also enjoys family time with her husband of 25 years, adult children Dennis, 22, Cora, 18, and newest addition to the family, Cora's infant son, Malachi. A new grandmother for the first time, Christian especially treasures time with him and this time in her life. ■
